Need and Community Benefits</b> <i>Describe a compelling need and benefits to the entire community</i>	Clearly outlines the community need and context, and provides explicit descriptions of how the project will address that need and create benefit. Provides clear examples of the need as well as the benefit.	Outlines the community need, and clearly describes the project impact on that need. Provides some examples of each.	Makes some effort to identify need and impact but does not provide specific examples.	Provides a sense of the community need, but does not describe the benefit adequately. Or, describes benefit without statement of the need. Examples are used sparingly and/or ineffectively	Description of need is disconnected from project benefit. No context is given and examples are not used.
<b>2. Community Outreach Plan</b> <i>Describe a plan for community outreach</i>	Provides a very well thought out community outreach plan with timeline of outreach efforts, potential community partners, and specific, clearly stated goals for outreach.	Provides a thorough community outreach plan with timeline and potential community partners listed, and general goals for outreach.	Provides a community outreach plan listing general activities, with mention of 1-2 community partners. Goals are not deeply articulated, and timeline is very general.	Provides a very broad community outreach plan listing 1-2 activities, with little/no mention of community partners. Goals and Timeline are not articulated.	Insufficient detail is provided on outreach plan, with no timeline or description of partners.
<b>3. Project Sustainability</b> <i>Demonstrate plans to sustain the project after the funding cycle ends if applicable</i>	A well developed project sustainability plan provides information on staffing/future leadership, potential funders, and specific efforts that will serve to maintain the project. If project is a one-time efficiency effort, this section covers plans for it to continue educating the community after completion.	Sustainability plan provides activities and details of future staff and community engagement. Ongoing education efforts are well described and timing is discussed.	Sustainability plan provides general detail of future staffing and community engagement. Ongoing education efforts are described generally.	Sustainability plan provides vague plans of future staffing and community engagement, with little/no timeline. Ongoing education efforts are described lightly if at all. Measureable Impacts/Benefits</b> <i>Provide short-term and long-term measureable educational and environmental benefits</i>	Provides detailed educational and environmental impact goals, using accepted metrics (e.g. kWh saved, students engaged). Discussion of methodology for ongoing tracking of actual benefits against these goals is included.	Provides educational and environmental goals, using accepted metrics (e.g. kWh reduced, dollars saved). Brief discussion of methodology for tracking of actual benefits is included.	Some educational and environmental goals are shared, with intermittent use of accepted metrics (e.g. kWh reduced, dollars saved). discussion of methodology for tracking of actual benefits is included, but not detailed.	Some educational and environmental goals are brief, and unsupported by accepted metrics (e.g. kWh reduced, dollars saved).
